About the Class: The FLO course, sponsored by NTAC and the Nye County (Pahrump) Justice Court provides the necessary enabling tools to proactively develop, collect, retrieve, and disseminate information and intelligence pertaining to terrorism and multi-jurisdictional crime related issues, in an effort to identify terrorists or suspects engaged in ongoing criminal activities. The course is outlined as follows:

1. The FLO/TLO Program: duties and responsibilities of FLOs and signs of radicalization
2. Domestic Terrorism threats (including Sovereigns and Anti-Government movements)
3. Brief overview of the International Terrorism threat
4. Fusion center 101
5. Federal crimes of Terrorism and the role of the United States Attorney in Terrorism
6. Information gathering, sharing, and reporting of Suspicious Activity Reports (SARs)
7. Warning signs of terrorism
8. Infrastructure protection and key resources
